

The Korean War



Place each of the events below on the timeline.

- Korea split between Communist North and pro-American South.
- China warns the UN troops not to advance farther. When the UN does, China enters the war on the side of the North and pushes the UN back to the Yalu River.
- Because the USSR was boycotting the United Nations, the UN was able to vote to send troops to stop the invasion.
- With the help of the Soviets, the North Koreans took over all but a small part of the country.
- MacArthur is fired by President Truman for publicly criticizing the way Truman was fighting the war.
- In June 1950, North Korea attacks South Korea in hopes of reuniting them.
- A truce is signed leaving Korea split at the 38th parallel, almost the exact spot where it was split before the war began.
- Gen. MacArthur leads troops to cut off the North's supplies and forces them back almost taking control of all of Korea in the process.
